Assembly 206 January Meeting Report:**Sue Caldwell****(Photographs by Danna Luther)****Guest Lecturer The Real Mark Wilson**

Our January 18 meeting was a full house for the members-only appearance of **Mark Wilson** and **Nani Darnell**. 1st VP **Doc Seaton** opened the meeting and called for announcements:

Past President **Hull Youngblood** explained that he had virtually passed the wand of Presidency to **Carl Seagren** at the Christmas party, but since neither had been able to attend, Hull would now hand over the office. Hull presented two awards: Member of the Year to **Tammy Dietz**, who helped make the stage contest a great success and put together the Christmas banquet; and Officer of the Year to **Heather Poggi-Mannis**, treasurer both for the club and for TAOM 2010.

2nd VP **Ron Cartlidge** said it is a critical time for membership: 16 members were due to renew in December or January. He reminded all that one must be a member of S.A.M. national to be a local member. He presented a 10-year-membership certificate to **Mike Gold**, and new member certificates to **Richard Turner** and to **Sharron Cartlidge**. He said that **Ian Varella** had renewed, and we had two new members (sponsored by Bob Carroll): **Joel Bergh** and **Robin Julien**. [Ed. note: Heather later said **Sean Granger** and **Lee Page** also joined.]

Kent Cummins announced that he has officially stepped down as head of

the Kent Cummins Magic Camp, and that Aaron Parker-Fasel is now the Executive Director.

Kent then introduced the guest lecturers. He explained that we have a club member named Mark Wilson, and had obtained his permission to call tonight's guest The Real Mark Wilson. Kent said Mark Wilson was the single most influential person in magic in the 20th century. His book, **Mark Wilson's Complete Book of Magic**, is the standard for anyone trying to learn magic. People asked Kent how we were able to get such a famous person to come here just for our meeting. He said it was simple: he just asked him!

Mark said this would be a different type of lecture for him. He thanked Carl and Kent for the hospitality shown to him and to his wife and assistant, Nani Darnell. He presented a DVD showing excerpts of their appearances on TV: *The Magic Land of Allakazam* (1960-65), the first magic show on TV; *Magic Circus*, a series of 6

specials on early TV; and Magic of Mark Wilson syndicated series. They also appeared on many talk and variety shows. He designed effects for many shows, including Columbo and Bill Bixby's The Magician series. He showed how they could tailor a magic show to showcase a sponsor for an ad campaign, and included cutting Nani in half for a Kawasaki production.

Mark said magic is international and universal. It is universal in entertaining all ages, from preschool to the elderly. To illustrate its international appeal, he showed scenes from their trip to China in 1980, when they were the first Western entertainers in 32 years. Mark cracked that, thanks to Mao, he was the only person in a country of a billion people who had a zigzag, which he used on Nani. People everywhere they went loved the show.

Mark said that a young man (or girl, interjected Nani) who is interested in magic is more intelligent. He said people's color and language don't matter – people recognize magic when you do it. "Magic makes you a special person." Mark said that people always remember him because he does magic. He always carries with him the color-changing knife trick [which he demonstrates], which has gotten him seating at restaurants without having a reservation.

He said they had done more illusions than anybody else. For example, there

were 99 Allakazam episodes, and there was a new illusion in each. An illusion need not be expensive to be good. He showed the Victory Cartons effect as one example of a very inexpensive illusion.

Mark said the first premium given from a magic show was a magic book given for 12 Dr Pepper bottle caps; they received 300,000 caps in Fort Worth alone!

Mark then demonstrated and taught several tricks that use materials at hand in a bar: the torn-and-restored paper napkin, and a transfer move with two corks. He suggested that one of the best ways to get an audience involved in a magic performance is to teach such simple tricks to them. He taught another trick: holding a length of rope by the ends, and tying a knot in the middle without appearing to let go of either end.

The world's best card trick, he said, is Out of this World by Paul Curry; he demonstrated and taught it, but explained that it is not in his book. He said it is so

Member Spotlight: Greg Johnston

Greg was born in Huntsville, AL. His Dad was a “rocket scientist” at Redstone Arsenal (ed., sounds like Richard Garriott), which was part of Marshall Space Flight Center. His Dad worked on the Saturn V rocket during the Apollo missions. His Mom was a High School Home Economics teacher. Both are huge positive influences and major blessings in his life. He is an Eagle Scout and attended Ole Miss (BBA, Banking & Finance). His Boy Scout Troop just celebrated their 700th Consecutive Monthly Campout in Tupelo, MS, and Greg attended...with his father who helped start the tradition 58 years ago.

During high school, he also participated in the Guinness World Book of Records Under Water Monopoly Game; his team played 200 hours under water, shattering the old record of 144 hours! He got the certificate, and then Guinness decided the event was apparently just *too* ridiculous, and removed it from the record book! Hmfffff!

After graduation, he joined Trammell Crow Company in Houston as a Commercial Property Manager, which was really more like crisis management. In the first 4 months, the properties he ‘managed’ had a murder, attempted suicide, hostage situation involving 8 professional thieves trying to steal \$20M worth of medicinal cocaine, drug busts, and armed repossessions of commercial tenant spaces ~2x/month.

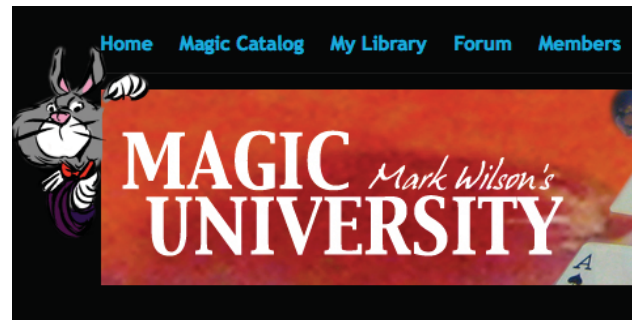

strong that it must be the closing of a show. It even fooled Churchill in World War II! It uses a borrowed, shuffled deck.

Mark is moving into the 21st century with markwilsonmagicuniversity.com, which sends members 3 new tricks each week and provides on-line instructional videos for each. Mark showed one sample from the site, the Comedy Cut and Restored Rope.

Mark explained the inherent problem of trying to patent a magic trick: The patent itself reveals the trick to the public.

Mark saluted Nani as “the lady who has participated in more different illusions than anyone else.” He closed the lecture with a video montage of Nani Darnell in an assortment of effects.

During the intermission and after the tumultuous standing ovation at the end, Mark signed copies of his classic book, while Nani sold DVDs ranging from lectures to their old TV shows to tricks such as the Color Changing Knives.

Feature Article**by: Kent Cummins****THE MAGIC WON'T WORK IF YOU DON'T BELIEVE!****The Magic of Believing**

I first heard of *The Magic of Believing*, by Claude M. Bristol, when I read an article many years ago about Phyllis Diller, who said that this book had changed her life. It was probably one of those personality pieces in *Parade* magazine, and I probably still have the article somewhere in the stacks of paperwork that I have been saving for the past 67 years (although they may be composting by now). Now that I'm officially "retired," maybe I will be able to get them organized again. Or maybe Margot and I will move to Catalina instead.

But I digress. (Hull says that I always provide too much context for everything. We discussed this at Chinatown restaurant on Greystone.....)

I immediately went out and found a new 1969 paperback edition, and read it. (Hull...in 1994, I finally bought a hardbound edition, Eleventh Printing, September 1950, for \$3.95 at the Travis County Adult Literacy Council BookFest '94 at The Arboretum.)

I agreed with the ideas espoused by Bristol, but I felt that I was already steeped in *The Power of Positive Thinking*, from a book by Norman Vincent Peale that my dad gave me when I was still living at home. The concepts are much the same,



and are the basis for most of the motivational texts available. In fact, Bristol uses the phrase, "law of attraction" (page 54) which is cited by today's motivational authors.

Bristol first published his book in 1948, when I was 5 years old. Across from the title page is this quote:

"If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth." Mark 9:23.

As I said, the basic concept is not new. In fact, it's the same "secret" that has recently been popularized by my friend and Assembly 206 member Joe Vitale.

WHAT DOES THIS HAVE TO DO WITH SAM ASSEMBLY 206?

Our assembly has become one of the biggest and best magic clubs in the world. How? By people BELIEVING that we could.

Opie Houston saw a dying assembly with only nine paid members...but he

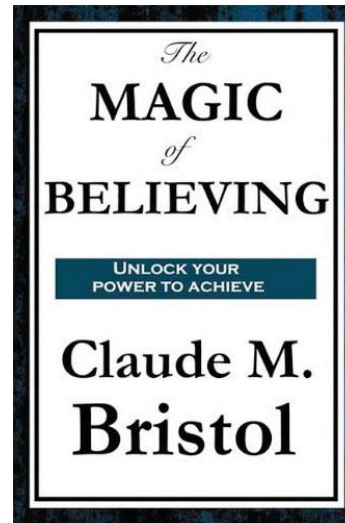

WHAT IS NEEDED.

The Close-up rooms and shows will be some of the best EVER produced at ANY Convention. But to make them really work,

WE NEED YOUR HELP:

We have 5 close-up rooms with 50 seats each, and we need 3 volunteers for each room. **We NEED VOLUNTEERS FOR THE FOLLOWING JOBS – Be part of the “CLOSE-UP CREW”:**

5 - Hosts – welcome guests, introduce performers, and handle the trivia contest during delays.



5 - Techs – responsible for operating sound and lights, music cues, radio contact, etc.

5 - Ushers/Supervisor– Be at the door, help with seating, avoid overcrowding in the room.

6 – Handlers – one for each of the close-up performers, get them from room-to-room on time.
